ASSESSMENT WEEK - YEARS 11-13

Senior Assessment Week begins next week on Friday 15 September. All students should be familiar with their exam timetable and have started preparing for these important exams.

Students need to note that if for some serious reason they are unable to attend an NCEA exam at the end of the year, their derived grade could be based on these practice exams.

Students need to be at school and assembled at the location indicated on the whiteboard by the outside stage at least 10 minutes before exams start. **Exams start at 8:40 and 12:10.** If it is raining, they should wait in the M block foyer.

ID cards OR another form of ID such as driver's licence or NZQA card **MUST** be brought to the exam to enable us to take an accurate roll.

Pens and pencils must be in a clear plastic bag. No exam notes or other material is allowed in the exam. Students may bring a bag but it will be stored at the front of the room or outside for hall exams. They should be careful about putting valuables in their bags. They must not have their phone on their person; it should be kept in their bag and be switched off or on silent. **If they are found with a phone during the end of year exams, they may not receive any results for that standard.**

Only water in a clear bottle can be brought into the exam. No food will be permitted.

These exams are compulsory and a roll will be taken. If students are sick, they should see or call Mrs Campion (07 827 5415, ext 887), and they will be booked in to sit their missed exam on Friday 22 September. If this is not possible, they will be required to attend after school on Tuesday 26 September. You will be advised via email if the after school session is required.

Usual school rules of behaviour and uniform apply.
