Upcoming Co-requisite Exams

The corequisite exams are happening in week 6 of this term for Year 10 students and any senior students who haven't yet attained them. Reading is on **Monday 25 May**, Writing on **Tuesday 26 May** and Numeracy on **Wednesday 27 May**. Junior students will complete their corequisite exams in period 1 and 2, senior students in period 3 and 4.

Please remind students to complete their My NZQA login registration if they haven't already done so.

Students sitting the corequisite exams need to arrive prepared with the following equipment:

1. A fully charged and updated device running chrome (no ipads).
2. School ID card
3. Their NZQA login saved (students cannot bring any paper into the exam).
4. Headphones for using POLLY (text to speech assistance) in the writing and numeracy exams.
5. A pen.
6. A calculator and ruler for numeracy exam.

7. The exams are full NCEA rules so **no watches, phones** etc. Equipment needs to be in a clear plastic bag (zip lock bags are great) and any drink bottles must be clear with no writing.
8. Year 10 students should bring a book to read afterwards.

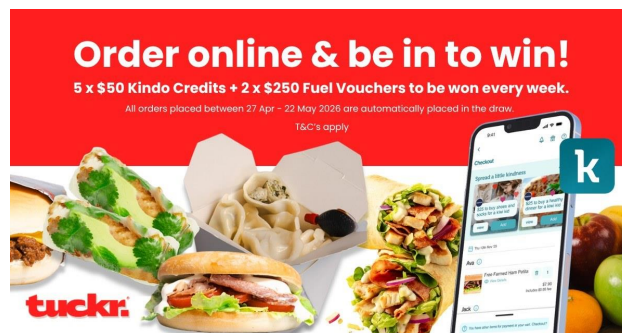
Host Families Urgently Required!

INTRODUCING SCHOOLBRIDGE

SchoolBridge is a communication platform, available on the web and as an app, that seamlessly links caregivers, students, and the school.

This will be used for all absence notifications, permission slips, school notices and more. SchoolBridge will be the central sign in point for our school, providing easy access for Students, Parents/Caregivers, and Staff. SchoolBridge will connect you to Kindo and the Kamar Parent Portal by clicking the tiles on the main page without the need to log into separate apps. We encourage all parents and caregivers to download the app and enable notifications so you can stay connected and support your child's school experience.

Web Sign In

- Go to our school's homepage (www.camhigh.school.nz) and click the **SCHOOLBRIDGE** button in the top right.
- Click on your account type: Parent/Caregiver, Student, or Staff
- Students and Staff can sign in using their Microsoft account

- Parents & Caregivers can sign in using the **email address you have registered with the school**
- Caregivers can sign in easily if your email address is registered with one the following services
 - **Apple** (icould.com, mac.com, me.com)
 - **Google** (gmail.com or other google account)
 - **Yahoo** (yahoo.com, ymail.com)
 - **FaceBook**
 - **Microsoft** (outlook.com, hotmail.com, live.com, msn.com)
 - **Zoho** (zoho.com, zohomail.com)
- If your email address is not registered with one of the above services, you can use the **Magic Link** sign in option to receive an email that contains a link allowing you access.

From 1 February 2026 all absences and leave passes need to be submitted through SchoolBridge.

Reporting an absence now takes just a few moments.

Please follow the steps below:

1. LOG INTO SCHOOLBRIDGE:

Open the **SchoolBridge app** on your phone (*If you haven't downloaded it yet, search "SchoolBridge" in your app store*)

Or log in via the link on the **Cambridge High School website**.

2. SELECT "REPORT ABSENCE":

Once logged in, simply tap the **Report Absence** button on the home screen.

3. CHOOSE THE TYPE OF ABSENCE:

Select the most accurate reason for your child's absence from the list provided.

4. ENTER THE DATES:

Select the **first day** your student will be absent.

Select the **end date** of the absence (*SchoolBridge allows you to submit up to five days at a time*)

5. PROVIDE A REASON:

Enter a brief explanation for the absence so our attendance team has the correct information.

6. SUBMIT:

Tap **Submit Absence**. You can also view past notifications by opening your **Absence Report**.

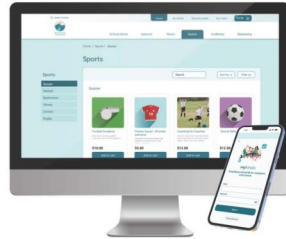

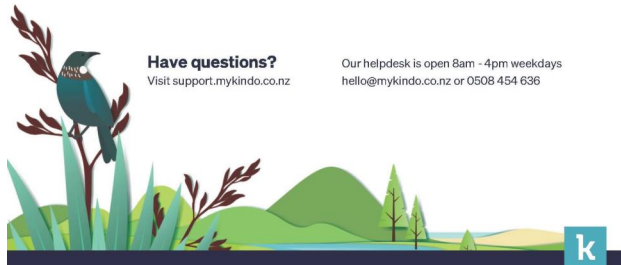

Student Sickness

When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's well-being and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...

- I have a **runny nose** or just a **little cough**, but no other symptoms.
- I have **NOT** had a fever overnight and have **NOT** taken fever reducing medicine during that time.
- I have a **mild stomach ache**.
- I have **not thrown up** overnight and can drink liquids without throwing up.
- I have a **mild rash** and no other symptoms.
- I have **eye drainage** **WITHOUT** fever, eye pain or eyelid redness.



KEEP ME AT HOME IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 38C**.
- I have **thrown up two or more times** in the past 24 hours.
- My **stool is watery** and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.



SEEK MEDICAL CARE IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 38C** **AND** any of the following: ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.
- I have **stomach pain and fever**, I have **bloody or black stool**, or I am **dehydrated** (tired and sleepy, dry mouth) and/or I have **not urinated** in the last 8 hours.
- I have a **persistent cough or trouble breathing**, or have a fever with the cough.
- I have **eye swelling, eye pain or an eye injury**.
- I have a **rash that has blisters**, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises, and/or I have a fever with the rash.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.

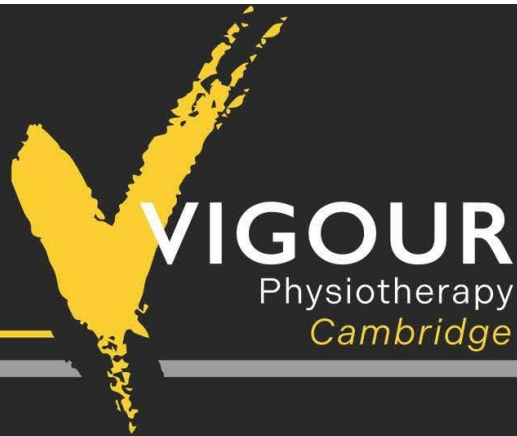
