Cutting-Edge Classrooms Near Completion



Almost 30 years after its initial construction, Cambridge High School's newly refurbished Marshall Block is getting ready to reopen featuring new technology and teaching spaces.

The building, first opened in August 1998, has been closed for refurbishments all year and Acting Principal Paul McAvoy expects it to reopen in the first half of Term 3.

The months-long work has included recladding for weather tightness as well as changes to the internal layout resulting in additional teaching spaces and modern technology.

“It's kept the tradition around M block which has been there for close to 30 years but at the same time it's a cutting-edge learning environment able to help students make the best of their time here at CHS,” Mr McAvoy says.

Nepal Trip 2027



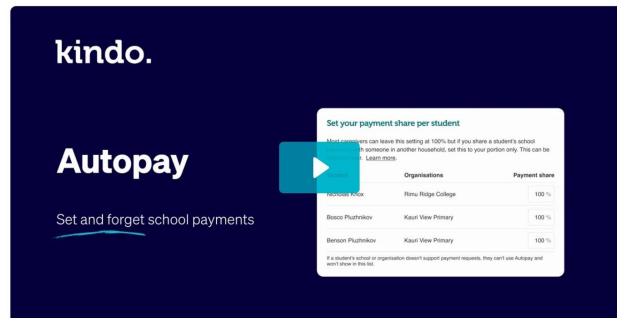

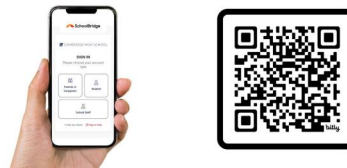

INTRODUCING SCHOOLBRIDGE

SchoolBridge is a communication platform, available on the web and as an app, that seamlessly links caregivers, students, and the school.

This will be used for all absence notifications, permission slips, school notices and more. SchoolBridge will be the central sign in point for our school, providing easy access for Students, Parents/Caregivers, and Staff. SchoolBridge will connect you to Kindo and the Kamar Parent Portal by clicking the tiles on the main page without the need to log into separate apps. We encourage all parents and caregivers to download the app and enable notifications so you can stay connected and support your child's school experience.

Web Sign In

- Go to our school's homepage (www.camhigh.school.nz) and click the **SCHOOLBRIDGE** button in the top right.
- Click on your account type: Parent/Caregiver, Student, or Staff
- Students and Staff can sign in using their Microsoft account
- Parents & Caregivers can sign in using the **email address you have registered with the school**
- Caregivers can sign in easily if your email address is registered with one the following services
 - **Apple** (icould.com, mac.com, me.com)
 - **Google** (gmail.com or other google account)
 - **Yahoo** (yahoo.com, ymail.com)
 - **FaceBook**
 - **Microsoft** (outlook.com, hotmail.com, live.com, msn.com)
 - **Zoho** (zoho.com, zohomail.com)

Student Sickness

When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's well-being and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...

- I have a **runny nose** or just a **little cough**, but no other symptoms.
- I have **NOT** had a fever overnight and have **NOT** taken fever reducing medicine during that time.
- I have a **mild stomach ache**.
- I have **not thrown up** overnight and can drink liquids without throwing up.
- I have a **mild rash** and no other symptoms.
- I have **eye drainage WITHOUT** fever, eye pain or eyelid redness.



KEEP ME AT HOME IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 38C**.
- I have **thrown up two or more times** in the past 24 hours.
- My **stool is watery** and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.



SEEK MEDICAL CARE IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 38C AND any of the following:** ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.
- I have **stomach pain and fever**, I have **bloody or black stool**, or I am **dehydrated** (tired and sleepy, dry mouth) and/or I have **not urinated** in the last 8 hours.
- I have a **persistent cough or trouble breathing**, or have a fever with the cough.
- I have **eye swelling, eye pain or an eye injury**.
- I have a **rash that has blisters**, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises, and/or I have a fever with the rash.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.

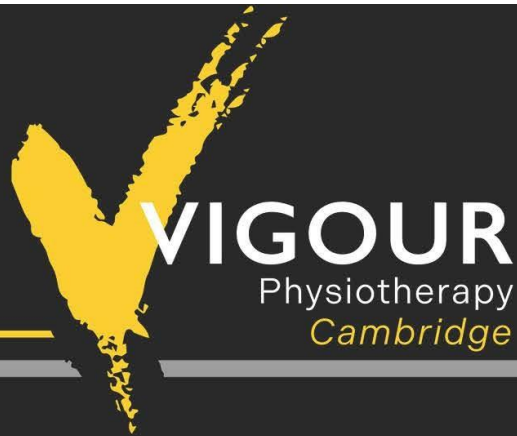
