Tradition relates to the castle, symbol of lasting strength.


Respect relates to the key, the key of life.

THE DAILY TIMETABLE

Each day except Thursdays begins at 8:40 am and finishes at 3:15 pm. Thursdays starts at 8:50 am. Punctuality to classes is expected at all times and lateness will only be accepted with an appropriate note.

BICYCLES

The bicycle stands are located beside the end of the bike track. The track entrance is opposite Grosvenor Street.

All students are encouraged to have their own bike lock but the bicycle stands are locked during the day.

Remember to be safe: do not ride on the footpath, know your road rules and ALWAYS wear your bike helmet.



BUSES

Mr Stichbury is the teacher in charge of all matters relating to bus pupils. The bus loading area is situated by the main entrance to school off Swayne Road. Pupils must be prompt, line up in an orderly fashion and behave while on the bus. He can be contacted at gs@camhigh.school.nz

Students found to be behaving inappropriately on buses may be banned from using the service.



BYOD (BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE)

Cambridge High School is a Bring your own Device school. This means every student requires a laptop to bring to school each day for learning purposes in every year level. Ours is a "blended learning" approach where students work both digitally and more traditionally writing in books. We do not offer fully online courses. Digital technology and learning are part of each programme, providing the potential to enhance and increase engagement in learning, and help students learn important digital skills.

Each teacher will share many resources in their subject or class Teams. These can be accessed from home as well as within school. In many subjects, homework will be accessed and completed digitally. Subject or Class Teams will also be used by teachers to communicate with students, and for students to collaborate.

The school provides O365 free of charge to students.

There is a lot of information on the school website on digital learning and BYOD. In particular, parents and students should read carefully <u>BYOD FAQ for Parents</u>. This outlines the device specifications, our blended approach, and the responsibilities of students when using their devices. Students will also need to be sign and be familiar with the cyber-safety agreement (also found on the Cambridge High School website).

The school has support in place if a family is unable to purchase a laptop outright. If you need further information, please email Mrs Webb, Deputy Principal, on ce@camhigh.school.nz for details.

CAREERS

Careers education is integrated into the curriculum and gives a rich and varied approach to learning about careers and pathways for students. School wide, we use an interactive computer programme called <u>Career Central</u>, where students can complete individual Future Pathway assessments and explore a large job database.

There is variety of career information and advice available in the Pathways Department and from the Careers Advisor, Ms Judson.

COMMUNICATIONS AND NOTICE BOARDS

CHS values good communication with our students, parents/caregivers and the community. You can help by making use of ALL of the following means of communications.

SCHOOL WEBSITE

The <u>CHS Website</u> will be a live and dynamic site which stores up to date information and provides connections with our other communication channels. The CHS student media team will use it to share their stories and images of school life. CHS will use it to store documents relevant to prospective and existing staff and students. It will be a more formal and edited piece of communication.

DAILY NOTICES

Teachers access these daily and they are read out during Form Time. They are also displayed on the notice boards, on the CHS Website.

COMING EVENTS

Our Coming Events page keeps you and your family informed of our upcoming events and student successes. The link to Coming Events is emailed home each Wednesday and available to view on the CHS Website.

EMAIL

This direct method will be the primary method of targeted communication with parents, staff and students.

SCHOOL FACEBOOK

This will be used to share our more informal communication, promotion of upcoming events and to facilitate sporting and cultural groups. Other groups that include CHS students are likely to use the school name in their social media group. In this case the group must be closed. CHS will maintain a register of these groups and may require their closure if they could potentially harm the reputation of the school.

LOCAL MEDIA

This is important for maintaining our reputation and the understanding of CHS, particularly with the CHS community. We recognise that many of these community members will not actively seek information about CHS, but will remain informed through local media.

FORM TEACHER

On most days at 10:40 to 11:00 am you will meet up with your Form Teacher and Form Class. At CHS we have Vertical Form Classes which means that throughout this part of the day you will be spending time with students from Year 9 through to Year 13. Each of the members of your Form Class will also be in the same House and you are likely to spend your entire time at CHS in this Form Class.

During this time you will take part in a variety of activities aimed to support you with your pastoral and academic well-being as well as engaging in House pursuits.

Your class will be identified by the 3-4 letters under your name on your Timetable. The last letter refers to your house. The first 2-3 letters refers to your Form Teacher.

Remember your Form Teacher should always be your first contact with any queries or concerns. They, along with your House Dean and Assistant House Dean, are always there to help you in your new school.

WHAANAU FORM CLASS

The aim of the Whaanau Form Classes is for them to work within a framework of Te Ao Maaori to provide support and assistance for its students during their schooling at Cambridge High School. There is a total of six Whaanau Form Classes that operate across the six houses and have a strong connection and relationship with one another.



Matua Corbett, our Te Reo Maaori teacher overseas these Form Classes, his email is cb@camhigh.school.nz.

Students that choose to enter a Whaanau Form Class will go into the one associated with his/her house. Like the mainstream form classes, Whaanau Form classes also operate vertically (Year 9 to Year 13) and are facilitated by Cambridge High School staff.

Anyone can join a Whaanau Form Class so do ask if you are interested in being included in one.

HOMEWORK

Homework serves an important role in developing good study and work habits in our high school students. Our knowledge of the "Science of Learning" shows that repetition, and reinforcement of skills and concepts, are important to mastery. Teachers post homework for each class in their Class Teams or on-line programmes like Education Perfect. This can be accessed by students from any computer with internet connection. In general, students can expect homework from each day's subject every night in the region of:

Year 9 - 40-60 minutes Year 10 - 60 minutes Senior School - 1 - 2 hours

COMPUTER SYSTEMS TIPS

The following are helpful tips to using our school computer system:

- Log onto Office 365 using your email address and school password
- •Log on a school PC using your username (not email address) and password. Any teacher can give you these details.
- Printing For the first time usage, use the Kamar number on timetable and generate your own 4-digit pin when prompted (4 numbers, no letters). Input the 4-digit pin twice.
- All printing is done to Virtual BW and Virtual C printers. This means once sent to these printers you can release the job from any printer when logging in to that printer. There is also a link on the top of the school website for web print which means you can print from outside of school or on CHS Public wifi.
- WIFI CHSBYOD is the SSID to log on for school student wifi access. Make sure the page
 has redirected to Google before using the wifi. You may need to set certificate to do not
 validate.
- Kamar Portal use logon credentials to view school progress, the students' timetable, etc. Parents and students have their own separate logins and passwords that are emailed or posted at the start of the year. This portal contains: Notices, Calendar, Details, Timetable, Attendance, NCEA Summary, Current Year Results, All Results, Groups, Pastoral, Awards, Reports, Fees, Profile, and Library.

HEALTH AND SAFETY IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY CLASSROOMS

In line with the updated (2016) Health and Safety Act, all students are required to wear closed-in shoes when they are in Science Laboratories or in Technology Workshops (including the Food and Fabrics classrooms).

Students must bring a change of footwear to take part in lessons in these rooms, for their own safety. If students are not wearing closed toe shoes, they will either be asked to put on a pair of our hard toe boots or will not be allowed to take part in the lesson. If these school shoes are not a part of the school uniform they may only be worn for the Science and Technology lesson.

GUIDANCE COUNSELLING TEAM

Guidance Counselling at Cambridge High School is set up to provide students with a safe and supportive environment in which students can speak about and address problem issues in their lives.

The three Guidance Counsellors are Mr Gleave <u>gl@camhigh.school.nz</u> , Mrs Zara Tester <u>ztr@camhigh.school.nz</u>

Students can attend counselling in a variety of ways:

- 1. They can self-refer by email (as above) or by asking the Counsellors directly;
- 2. They can be referred directly by a member of the Senior Leadership Team, a House Dean or other members of the teaching staff;
- 3. The school nurse can ask them to speak with students, or;
- 4. Parents and Caregivers can also ask them to speak to their children.

The counselling team offices are located across the hall from the School Nurse. If you are unsure about how to arrange an appointment, ask at the student office.

PASTORAL CARE

When students face wellbeing challenges the pastoral care team at our school are there and available to assist. Provisions for assisting with stress, anxiety, physical and emotional health are available. These services are available by request from students, teachers and caregivers. Access is by way of an approach to our care team; House Dean or directly with the counsellors or the nurse.

HOUSE SYSTEM

Cambridge High School has six 'Houses' named after significant local historical stories and landmarks. These names were gifted to the school by Mana Whenua and create a sense of connection to Cambridge that goes back many, many years.

They are **Horotiu** - HAWKS (Red), **Parawhau** - TOA (Black), **Pukeroro** - STINGRAYS (Grey/Silver), **Te Koopu Maania** - MANAIA (Green) **Te Koo Utu** - SHARKS (Blue) and **Te Oko Horoi** - TANIWHA (White). Each house has a House Dean, Assistant House Dean and Student Leaders (House Prefects and House Captains).

Cambridge High School is a community of learners and the House system aims to reflect these core values. Apart from the traditional swimming and athletic sports, there are a range of other house events throughout the year. These are designed to give all students a chance to compete, have fun and contribute to their House at a senior and junior level.

The aim of the House system is for all students to feel a sense of belonging to their House, school and community in a caring, sharing and challenging way. We encourage ALL STUDENTS to contribute to let the competition begin!



KAPAI AT CAMHIGH

If you see a student or teacher who is showing our school values, let them know you appreciate it. To do so, simply fill in the **online form**. Students will receive an acknowledgement and a message via their email. Teachers will get a Kapai card sent to them and will go into a fortnightly prize draw.

LOST PROPERTY

Lost property can be found at the Deans Office. Please remember to **NAME** your child's clothing.

NON-UNIFORM DAYS

Clothes should be clean, modest and appropriate. Students should not wear any offensive or revealing or unsafe clothing.

NURSE

The school has a full time Registered Nurse on site at all times. Two nurses share this role, Mrs Hendren and Mrs Gordon, who can generally be visited between the hours of 9:15 am and 3:15 pm. The nurse's office and sick bay are located in the Student Support building, opposite the Counsellors Offices.

LOCKERS

Student lockers are available on a first come first serve basis and students must provide their own lock. Lockers are cleared and reallocated at the end of each year. Student Office is available to assist students with lockers.

LIBRARY

The library at Cambridge High School is a real hub of the school. It sits at the end of the park like quad and is home to hundreds of students who access the many facets the library offers.

Our school library fosters the discovery and enjoyment of knowledge. The inviting and accessible environment is open to all and it is a place where the lifelong love of reading and learning is nurtured.

The library is open from 8.00am until 5.30pm every school day. Our comprehensive Youth Fiction collection is modern and extensive. This is supported by an excellent collection of Graphic Novels, Non-Fiction, DVDs and Magazines.

PC4L (POSITIVE CULTURE FOR LEARNING)

Positive Culrure for Learning is the CHS school-wide behaviour management approach. All students and staff play a part, and it is driven by our acronym of R.E.A.C.H and our five core values that it stands for:

Realise your Potential (Me Moohio ki too pito mata)

Engage with Purpose (Kia uu ki te Kaupapa)

Act with Integrity (Mahia ki te tika me te pono)

Care of People and Places (Manaakitia ngaa taangata me ngaa wahi)

Have Courage to Succeed (E riwha ai me niwha)

During their time at our school and through this program, students will be explicitly taught our expectations, consistently monitored and regularly acknowledged using one of our reward schemes. The CHS behaviour matrix can be viewed here.

R.E.A.C.H CERTIFICATES

At CHS we operate a reward programme that acknowledges students for the more substantial things they do at school. This system is accumulative throughout their time at school. The general aim is to recognize continuous or exceptionally high standards of behaviour, effort, academic, sporting, artistic or cultural performance.

PEER TUTORING

SPORT, ARTS AND CULTURAL

Cambridge High School believes that every student should have the opportunity to fully develop their potential both in and outside the classroom. ARTS AND CULTURE

Cambridge High School has a rich and varied cultural life. Music groups include a Concert Band, Vox Ensemble, Guitar Ensemble, Chamber Groups, Senior and Junior Jazz and Rock Bands. There is limited tuition for students in a range of instruments which are free and given during school time by skilled teachers. Our musicians regularly perform for school occasions, community groups and at festivals.

Te Piringa Maaori O Tauiwi, the School Maaori Culture Group performs regularly representing the school with dignity and strength. Students can be involved in Dance Troupes in a range of styles, including Hip Hop, Jazz, Contemporary, Lyrical and Musical Theatre. Within these troupes there are opportunities for performing within inclusive teams across junior, senior and combined teams. There are also opportunities for leadership as choreographers, committee members and mentoring roles. Troupes work toward competitions with DanceNZmade and participate in a range of community performances and showcases throughout the year.

We have a busy performance calendar with senior level productions, showcase evenings, visiting theatre companies and workshops form around NZ.

SPORT

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

SAS Sport are our official uniform suppliers and supply all <u>CHS</u> specific items. For inquiries, go to cambridgeshop@sas.co.nz or call 0273420020.

There is a retail shop open at 14 Wilson Street, Cambridge. Refer to CHS website for shop hours.

Cambridge High School is a uniform school and students are required to wear their uniform neatly and completely.

CHS and SAS are proud to announce that the Year 9 PE uniform (house shirt and shorts) are provided for free. If placing an order online please include PE uniform in your order but you are not required to pay for it. Alternatively, you can place your order in person in the uniform shop.

PLEASE NOTE: Cambridge High School support students choosing either uniform style, as long as they wear all of the uniform correctly and do not mix and match items.

The shorts and trousers are available in a female fit. As an example, this means a student could wear a polo shirt and female cut shorts as a part of the same style.

The school will take action when grooming and dress are unsatisfactory. Please note the following:

- All shirts and blouses are designed to be worn out, not tucked in.
- The winter uniform is also the formal uniform, to be worn as required when representing the school and for formal school attire.

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- The winter uniform may be supported by a thermal layer. This layer must be discrete, worn beneath the shirt and as close as possible to the same colour as the shirt, plain and with no branding on the sleeves.
- All footwear is to be worn properly and kept tidy at all times.
 Sandals must be plain black or brown roman style sandals only. This means sandals must have a strap over the front of the foot and an ankle strap, have black or silver buckles only and be flat soled. It is not permitted to wear socks with sandals. Shoes must be black leather (or leather look) lace-up school shoes only (not boots, canvas, sports shoes, slip- ons, suede or patent, no raised heel).
- Scarves, headbands and hair ties may be worn but must be in the colour of the uniform (i.e. navy blue, black or white)
- School uniform jackets are available for purchase. On days where the rain is heavy, non-uniform rain jackets (navy blue or black) may be worn to and from school.
- Only approved CHS branded hats may be worn. Caps and beanies are available from Argyle, bucket hats are available for purchase at our school office.
- The only jewellery permitted is plain studs or sleepers (one per ear), a watch and a
 culturally significant item, such as a taonga. Other body piercings e.g nose or eyebrow,
 must be free of jewellery during the school day. Clear sleepers may be worn in place of
 jewellery.
- Boys are to be clean shaven.

Physical Education and Sports
