NCEA Corner

Kia ora whaanau. Term 3 is exceptionally busy with CAA (corequisite) results being released to students, the next round of CAA exams approaching, derived grade exams happening for senior students and assessments being completed in most subjects.

CAAs.

Most students in Year 10 as well as many in Years 11 - 13 will have received their results from NZQA from the May round of the corequisite exams. Aakonga can access their results, along with their completed exams, via their MYNZQA login. Aakonga who were not successful in the May exam will be entered for the September sessions: **September 7th** Reading, **September 8th** Writing and **September 9th** Numeracy. Juniors will be completing their CAA exams in periods 1 and 2. Seniors in periods 3 and 4.

Derived Grade Exams.

The derived grade exam period for senior aakonga is happening between **Thursday 10th September** and finishing **Friday 18th September**. The derived grade exams are an excellent opportunity for purposeful study and give students a practice opportunity for their external assessments. Derived grades are also used in case of justified circumstances (such as medical or bereavement leave) that mean aakonga miss external exams. Therefore students should prioritise these exams and put ample time towards preparing for them. The exam timetable will be available shortly and will be posted on the school website. Any clashes or justified absences from these exams should be referred to Mr Cole to look to accommodate catch up sessions. His email is mce@camhigh.school.nz

Homework Centre.

To support aakonga with all this assessment we have our ongoing homework centre that is led by our academic committee, providing senior students to support all students with their study. The homework centre is open to all students and we recommend senior students take advantage of this as well in the lead up to derived grade and NCEA exams. Homework Centre happens in the library, after school for an hour on Days 1 and 7.

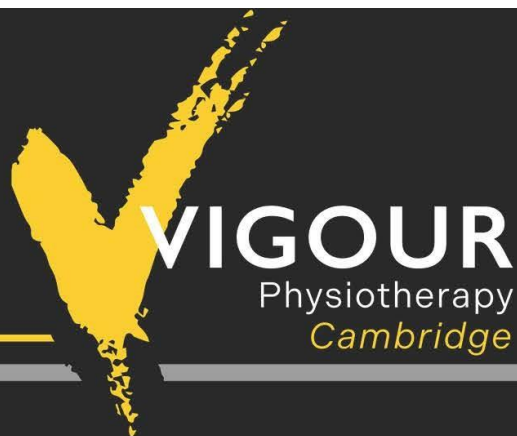
