Senior Derived Grade Exams

The Derived Grade Exams commence on **Thursday 10th Sept** and finish on **Friday 18th Sept** and are run under strict NZQA rules. Morning exams commence at 8.30am and afternoon exams at 12.10pm. Students will need their IDs and equipment in a clear plastic bag. No phones or watches are allowed. The exam timetable can be found on the school website:

<https://www.camhigh.school.nz/>. Students who are not sitting exams are expected to be at home studying, or if a quiet space is not available at home, in the school library.

Any students that miss either a CAA or DGE for a justified reason e.g. medical or bereavement leave, can apply for a catchup exam. Please email mce@camhigh.school.nz to arrange this.

Exam period – Thur Sept 10th – Fri Sept 18th

- Check the timetable and ensure you know what to expect for each exam. What standards are being covered, what equipment you will need etc.
- If you have a clash of exams then you need to email Mr Cole as soon as possible for a fix.
- These exams will give you a derived grade should you need one.
- If you miss an exam for a valid reason you are to email Mr Cole to arrange a catch up.
- Exams are being run with mostly NZQA rules.
- You must be in full school uniform and do the right thing at all times.



Study break during derived grade exams

You are not in school during the assessment weeks unless:

- You have an examination; or
- Have arranged a tutorial/catch up session with your teacher; or
- Are required to come into school for a catch-up session

Your teachers will not necessarily be available during your normal timetabled class time.

If you need to see them, make sure you contact them to arrange a suitable time before coming in to school



Before you Enter the Exam Room

- You must have your photo ID to enter the room. For the NCEA external exams you will also need to bring your NZQA Admissions Slip.
- Drink bottles must be clear and have no writing or labels on them
- Pens & pencils must be in a clear plastic bag
- No food is permitted in the exam room, including lollies & gum
- Calculator covers must be removed and left in your bag
- Bags must be left at the front of the classroom or outside the hall
- Phones must be switched off (not on silent) and left in your bag or in your emergency pack under your chair
- You must be in school uniform



Banned Items

- Any paper
- Correcting fluid
- Books, written or electronic notes
- Cell phones
- Dictionaries or translators
- Watches of any type
- Any electronic device which has storage, communication or information retrieval capability, except approved calculators
- Hoodies & Jackets



Once you are in the Exam Room

- No communicating or talking
- Follow instructions from supervisors who will direct you to your seat
- Your photo ID needs to be face up on your desk at all times throughout the exam
- You must not touch or open your exams/resource booklets until you are instructed to do so



Once you are in the Exam Room

- Write in blue or black pen only, unless stated on the cover of the exam booklet
- You must sit with both feet on the floor under your desk throughout the exam
- Exam and resource booklets must remain flat on your desk
- Drink bottles must be under your chair, not on your desk



Digital Exams

- Digital derived grade exams are on teams assignments or education perfect
- You need to come to digital exams with a fully charged laptop
- You cannot charge your laptop in the NCEA exams
- You must only have the exam window open on your device
- The exam screen must be maximised and brightness turned up, so your screen is clearly visible. You must stay on the exam screen at all times.



Digital Exams

- Turn off/disable all updates and notifications
- Classwise will be on and monitoring for all digital exams
- **If you miss a digital exam or are late you must not open the exam. If you open an exam from anywhere other than the supervised exam room you will be given an immediate Not Achieved.**



Leaving the Exam

- **You may not leave until 60 mins have elapsed in a two hour exam. You may not leave until 120 mins have elapsed in a three hour exam.**
- If you wish to leave, raise your hand and a supervisor will come over to you.
- You must not remove any paper from the exam room, this includes exam booklets, resource booklets & extra paper. Any digital exams must be turned in before you leave.



Leaving the Exam

- Once the supervisor has collected your exam booklets, you must leave quietly via the route they tell you.
- Once outside the room, quietly collect your bag and move quickly away from the exam room.
- **You must not remain on the school site after exams unless you have a genuine reason to do so e.g. waiting for a bus. All bus students must go to the library to wait.**



A Couple of Rule Reminders

- You must completely fill all pages of your exam booklet before requesting extra paper
- Extra paper can only be used for planning or notes in a digital exam and it must be handed in at the end of the exam to be destroyed
- There must be no writing on:
 - Rulers
 - ID cards
 - Any part of your body
- Do not write on yourself during the exam
- If a supervisor sees writing anywhere, except on your exam materials, a report will be sent to Mr Cole for investigation.



Derived Grades

- Derived grade results matter.
- To qualify for a derived grade you need to have a genuine and justified reason e.g. medical leave, bereavement, national representation in sports or culture
- It is a complex process and isn't guaranteed
- If you just decide not to sit your exam, you will not qualify for a derived grade



Finally

- On exam day
 - Arrive at school in good time for your exam (8.30 am or 12.15pm start)
 - Check the board outside the main office for your exam room – rooms include the hall, F Block, A1 and A2.
 - SAC students, report to the correct room (or WT if you are confused)
 - Move to your room with plenty of time
 - Listen to instructions from the supervisors
- Best of luck for your exams
- Any issues on exam day see Mr Cole

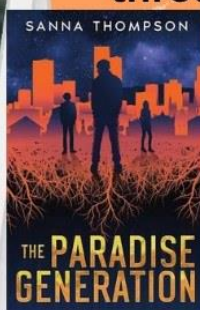

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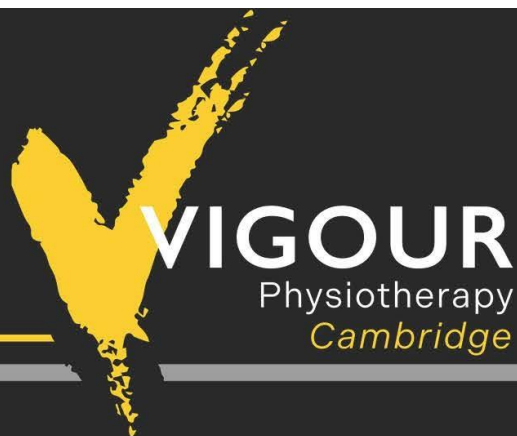
