BEE CARD – New public transport subsidies with Community Connect

For youth aged 13 and older to travel for half price, each passenger needs a registered Bee Card.

Bee Cards can be purchased from your nearest retailer or ordered online for \$5 (with a minimum top up of \$5). When ordered online, your Bee Card will be sent via post, so please allow up to 10 business days for the Bee Card to arrive.

Because there is an overnight process for the online Bee Card registration to activate, we're encouraging our passengers to organise their Bee Card's prior to travelling.

The government's budget announcements for public transport are now in place, so from 1 July 2023 there is now free public transport for children under 13 and half price for youth under 25, as part of the new Community Connect scheme.

We are strongly urging caregivers and young people to **purchase your Bee Cards for each passenger and register their details – before you travel** – to gain easy access to these new fares across the Waikato transport network.
