NCEA Change Programme – Key aspects



- Make NCEA more accessible
- Equal status for Maatauranga Maaori in NCEA
- Strengthen Literacy and Numeracy requirements and assessments
- Fewer, larger standards
- Simplify NCEA structure
- Clearer pathways to further education or work
- Keep NCEA Level One optional

How the NCEA qualification works



Two types of Standard:



New Achievement Standards (introduced in 2024)	Not Achieved / Achieved / Merit / Excellence	ENG1, MAT1, SCI1, PED1, GEO1, HIS1

Each Standard is worth a set number of credits at either NCEA Level One, Two or Three

NZQA Certificate requirements



NCEA qualification at any Level



Minimum of **80** credits for NCEA Level One, Two and Three, including

- **60** credits at a level or above
- 10 credit te reo matatini or Literacy Co-requisite
- 10 credit te paangarau or Numeracy Corequisite

How the Numeracy and Literacy Co-requisite works (2025 - 2027)



There will be 2 sittings of the Co-requisite Standards per year



 happens in May and September.
- Year 10s have been added to Literacy or Numeracy Teams. Year 11-13s have been added to their own Literacy and Numeracy teams. These include past exam papers and weekly tasks.




Preparing/support for the Corequisite CAA exams



- Core subjects provide literacy and numeracy teaching in Years 9, 10.
- Walke Maths Numeracy Essentials recommended text (\$18)
- Estudee.co.nz online assessment practice (\$20)

 Senior subjects in both Maths and English offer the alternative standards for Numeracy and Literacy at all levels.





What are students being tested on in the CAA?



- Literacy and numeracy CAA assessments pose questions to students that are related to their daily lives. It is numeracy and literacy for life, rather than a specific school subject.
- Exam questions/sections might include:
- ✓ Writing a letter to nominate someone for an award.
- ✓ Calculating trip lengths using maps.
- ✓ Understanding public transport schedules.
- ✓ Interpreting a set of written instructions.
- ✓ Reading information about the suitability of a product for a use.

In 2025 not all subject areas will offer the full 20 credits. For example:

English ENG1 – 20 credits

Science SCI1 – 16 credits

PE PED1 – 10 credits

Maths MAT1 – 15 credits

Where less than 20 credits are offered, they will be different combinations of AS1.1, AS1.2, AS1.3 and AS1.4.

Student **MUST** also either pass:

- US32405 (Literacy Writing) or
- 10 Additional Literacy credits from specific Level One Standards

NCEA Endorsement



There are two types of endorsement that students can be awarded

- Certificate Endorsement
- Subject Endorsement

Endorsement recognises high achievement

NCEA Certificate Endorsement



Shows high achievement across all subjects studied

NCEA Endorsed with Merit	NCEA Endorsed with Excellence
50 or more credits at Merit or higher	50 or more credits at Excellence

Credits from NCEA Level Two or Three can be used to endorse a Certificate at NCEA Level One. Credits at Level Three can be used to endorse at Level Two.

Credits for a Certificate Endorsement can be gained over more than one year.


Course Endorsement Excellence

For a Course Endorsement, at least 14 credits at the appropriate level in a single course. These must all be gained in the same calendar year and must include at least 3 credits internal and 3 credits external.

Not all subjects have Course Endorsement available.

Key things to be aware of:

Application for an Extension to an Internal Assessment

- Only available for "Justified" absences
- Holidays in school time, "Unjustified", no extensions
- Digital only form student requests from teacher



ASSESSMENT

Assessing student progress in their learning can take different forms and be both formal and informal. Examples can include building a portfolio of work, sitting a test, completing work outside of class or participating in a field trip.

Assessment expectations are clearly signposted to students and they are provided feedback so that they are always well-prepared to perform at their best.

CHS Policy For National Assessment - Authenticity



Managing the authenticity of submissions

For every submitted standard:

The use of chatbots, generative AI, paraphrasing tools, or other tools that can automatically generate content is not permitted and material generated by these tools should not be submitted as part of the candidate's work.

Teachers must closely supervise the process of evidence collection to ensure that candidates:

- do not copy from another person or source without appropriate acknowledgement
- do not receive guidance, scaffolding, instruction, assistance, or assessment conditions beyond what is specified as permissible in these Assessment Specifications

Where a teacher cannot verify that the assessment submitted is the authentic work of the candidate, they must notify NZQA of a possible Candidate Breach of External Assessment.


