I want to take this opportunity to wrap up the year with an acknowledgment of the contribution of the whole Cambridge community in providing opportunities for our students. Firstly, thank you the CHS staff for the care and dedication that goes into the student experience throughout the year, including the grounds and maintenance crew, the admin team and teachers. Thank you for the many and varied ways you have contributed to a very successful year at CHS as we experienced improved academic results, increased participation in Sports and Arts and inspiring levels of national and international success. In teaching, the emphasis of the national change in education is in the junior school and we have done a lot of work to re-imagine the junior learning experience. Thank you to our teaching staff for in making sure that the changes are accommodated within well-designed learning that is focused on a continual improvement of outcomes for students. We have seen evidence of this in several areas with increased academic success in our senior school and a significant number of students making more than one year's progress en route to achieving their Literacy and Numeracy qualifications. For instance, 30% of students who passed Numeracy in Year 10 this year did so by making greater than one year's progress in their learning during years 9 and 10. Thank you also to the many staff and community volunteers who make this a rich learning environment full of opportunities for our students. Through sports team managing coaching, dance, drama, music and more, we provide an incredible extra-curricular programme to sit alongside the high-quality academic experience. It takes a team of people to make this happen and I really appreciate the extra support of our volunteers in providing these opportunities for our students.

Property Update

We have received final confirmation of the start dates and timelines for the repair of M- block, This important work starts shortly and is due for completion by the start of Term 3 in 2026. This will involve the decant of 12 classrooms to be absorbed across the campus. Although we can accommodate all students and lessons, it is a very tightly timetabled allocation of rooms during the year. In recognition of this the Board and SLT felt that it was important to improve the layout of the building and increase classrooms now, while the repair work was being completed. This will do a lot to future proof the building and improve its functionality.



Uniform update

I sent out an update recently on the new uniform, but I wanted to follow that up with a couple of key messages.

- The bulk delivery of items will happen on the 15th January, meaning at this point you can purchase items directly from the Uniform Shoppe.
