Uniform shop update

NCEA exam final details

The NCEA external examinations begin on Monday 7 November. All students sitting the NCEA external examinations should now have received a copy of the NCEA Candidate Information Sheet and their Examination Admission Slip. Students should read the Information Sheet carefully so they are aware of the NCEA examination rules and expectations. Students must also check their Admission Slips shows all of the external examinations they should be entered for. If there are errors or omissions, please contact Mrs Joanna Bartch, Principal's Nominee urgently on JBH@camhigh.school.nz. Please look at the most recent coming events for more details and a reminder that the latest Coming Events are stored on the website <u>here</u>.

In particular, we are noticing an increase in COVID cases in our community. Please be cautious over the next few weeks. We have been given the following guidance from NZQA about how to approach the exams if your child is unwell during the examinations.

If a student has cold/flu symptoms and there are concerns about them attending the examinations they should take a Covid-19 test. If they **test negative**, they should attend their examination. Showing a negative test result at the examination indicates the Covid risk has been actively managed. If their **test is positive** that will be able to apply for a derived grade. The evidence needed to support the derived grade application could include, for example, a text PCR result, text from the Ministry of Health acknowledging the Covid report or a photo of the positive RAT result.

Junior examinations

CHS Junior Examinations will take place on Thursday and Friday of this week. Full details of these exams are in the coming events, and a reminder that the latest Coming Events are stored on the website <u>here</u>.

Students should be at their examination room by 8.30am for a morning session and 1.00pm for an afternoon session. Students have been allocated to examination rooms in alphabetical order and rooming information will be handed out in form class this week. If students are unsure of the room, they can check the white board at the outside stage or ask at the Student Office for help. There are over 21 different classrooms plus the hall being used for each examination session so it is important students go to their allocated room so they can sit the correct examination.

Where students miss one or more of their examinations due to sickness/absence there will be limited opportunities for them to sit the examinations on Monday 7 November and the morning of Tuesday 8 November.
